7. Diva Faustina I: undated, late 140 – 161

Chronological Issues

The Fasti Ostienses for A.D. 140 records that: 'On October 23(?) Faustina Augusta died and on the same day was named diva by the Senate and a senatorial decree was made awarding her a state funeral. Games and circus-races were offered. [Some unknown number of days before] November 13 Faustina's state funeral was celebrated, gold and silver statues were set up(?), and a senatorial decree.' Soon afterwards, Antoninus began issuing coinage in her honour, a practice he continued until the end of his reign.

The publication of Martin Beckmann's *Diva Faustina: Coinage and Cult in Rome and the Provinces*, has placed the dating and arrangement of the Diva Faustina coinage on a new footing. Beckmann has been able to construct an almost complete sequence of die-linkages for the aurei, supported by additional shorter, but corroborative, die-linkages amongst the aurei and the sestertii. These chains of issues have enabled Beckman to produce a fairly comprehensive and reliable sequence of relative dating. The occurrence at several points of rev. die-linkages to dated coins of Antoninus or Aurelius Caesar, and connections of issues to other dated events have enabled a rough chronology to be established.

The coinage is divided into five main phases commencing with the deification and funeral of Faustina. The issues listed under each phase are in the sequence indicated by the die-linkages. I have included lists other coin types issued for Diva Faustina under the phase to which they should probably be assigned; these types are not included in Beckmann's die-linkage chains, and are therefore presented in alphabetic rather than chronological order.

Discussion: The Problem of Non-Descriptive Reverses


(Or, By Their Attributes Shall Ye Know Them!)

Owing to the early demise of Faustina I, the range of coin types issued for her posthumously vastly outnumber those issued during her brief reign, and there is a considerable difficulty in identifying the figures depicted on the reverses of many of these coins. Obviously, the figure shown on a coin bearing a legend referring to Ceres, Juno, or Vesta can be safely identified as the goddess in question; the problem occurs on coins which do not bear a descriptive legend that identifies the type, i.e., those with legends: AVGVSTA, CONSECRATIO, AETERNITAS, and those with anepigraphic reverses. Quite clearly the first three legends refer to the past, present, and future eminence of the late empress, and do not necessarily describe the type of the coin. It is possible to claim the figure on the reverses of these coins must be Faustina herself, but the differing range of attributes borne by the figure necessitates the figure being described as 'Faustina as . . .' and to go on to describe the deity or personification which Faustina is supposed to be representing. This creates a layer of descriptive redundancy, and it is clearer to describe a figure who appears to be Ceres as Ceres, and to understand that the range of goddesses and personifications depicted either represent the qualities that Faustina possessed in life or gained after death, or the immortals with whom she was now in closer communion for the benefit of the Roman people. The legend AETERNITAS causes an additional difficulty in that the goddess or personification of Aeternitas may also be represented on these coins, as well as other representations.

With the exception of the personification of Aeternitas, to be discussed below, none of these types is determined by the coin legends. In the absence of more specific identification, we are forced to rely upon the attributes borne by the individual figures to determine whom they represent. The first place to start is with the coins of Faustina herself which bear identifying legends; secondly to other coins issued by Antoninus; and only as a last resort to coin types issued at earlier or later periods.

Aeternitas

There are four main attributes that seen only on coins with the legend AETERNITAS, and can therefore be said to be determinative of the personification of Aeternitas. These are the Phoenix, the large circular hoop of the Zodiac, the large starry globe on which the figure is seated, and the starry veil billowing around head of the figure. The phoenix also appears on a few aes of Antoninus, but with rev. legends that only contain dating formulae. Sometime the midriff of the figure is seen to be bare and strewn with stars, and some catalogues have taken this symbol to indicate the personification of Aeternitas, but my own research has shown this feature to be widespread amongst the personifications on this coinage, and it is probably intended to indicate a 'posthumous' aspect of the deity concerned.

Aeternitas-Diana

One group of reverses in *aes* with the legend AVGVSTA shows a female figure 'with crescent on head,' 'holding starry veil which billows around head, and lighted torch'. This type equally combines attributes which would usually define the figure either as Aeternitas or Diana Lucifera, and therefore I have given this figure the compound name Aeternitas-Diana.

Ceres

On coins of Faustina I with the rev. legend CERES, Ceres is always portrayed holding cornears and torch. The corn-ears are a primary attribute, and are not borne by other personifications; we may therefore state that a figure holding corn-ears should be identified as Ceres. The torch is also borne by other personifications, such as Vesta and Diana, but unless other attributes indicate a different interpretation it may accepted that the torch is also determinative of Ceres.

One rev. type in *aes* with the legend CONSECRATIO shows a female figure 'sacrificing from patera over altar and holding long torch'. This type equally combines attributes which would usually define the figure either as Ceres or Pietas, and therefore I have given this figure the compound name Ceres-Pietas.

Cybele

Cybele is identified on coins of Faustina with the legend MATRI DEVM SALVTARI. She also appears on coins with various non-specific legends and can usually be identified by the *tympanum* or drum resting on her knee; she is usually accompanied by lions, or rides in a cart drawn by lions.

Fortuna

The rev. legend FORT[VNA] does not appear on coins issued for Faustina I, but is common on coins of Antoninus. The personification of Fortuna always appears with a rudder, and most often accompanied by a cornucopia. However, the rudder also appears as an attribute of Salus on coins of Antoninus, and of Venus on coins issued for Faustina II. As the rudder appears to be a primary attribute of Fortuna, but only a secondary attribute of either Salus or Venus, it has been taken in this study to be determinative of Fortuna. Fortuna also often bears either a globe or a patera; these attributes are secondary and not determinative of type.

Juno

On coins of Faustina I with the rev. legend IVNO or IVNONI REGINAE, Juno is usually portrayed holding an outstretched patera and sceptre. Neither attribute by itself is determinative of type, and either may appear in combination with other attributes, but the two attributes together can be taken to indicate that it is Juno who is being depicted. A related figure raising an empty r. hand, instead of a patera, and holding a sceptre is also universally accepted as representing Juno.

Pietas

On coins of Faustina I with the rev. legend PIETAS, Pietas is shown sprinkling incense over an altar and usually holding a box of perfumes in the other arm. Variations show the arm raised over the altar, but not obviously making an offering, likewise the box is omitted on some coins, whilst on others the box is held and the arm outstretched, but the altar is omitted. Whilst varying in specific details, these depictions create a similar picture, and we are probably justified in labelling any personification in this pose as Pietas.



Providentia

Two figures are depicted as holding up a globe, either in the I. hand with the r. hand upraised, or in the r. hand with the other holding a sceptre. These personifications are traditionally designated as Providentia, but this is problematic: the type is not designated by legends on coins of Faustina, and where the personification appears on coins of Antoninus, she does not hold a globe, but points at one on the ground. The globe held in the hand is a secondary attribute of Fortuna on the coins of Faustina, but there is always accompanied by the rudder. These two personifications are distinctive enough to warrant a separate designation, and with each the globe appears to be the primary attribute, therefore, in the absence of any alternative suggestions, I have retained the designated of the figure as Providentia.

Pudicitia

Pudicitia does not appear as a named type on coins of Faustina I, but does appear on coinage issued for Faustina II by Antoninus. One common attribute on these coins is that the figure uses one hand to raise up the hem of her skirt or robe. It is possible that when this attribute is seen it is being used to signify the personification of matronly modesty. This is not a primary personification on coins of Faustina I, but may be a secondary aspect of another personification.



Pudicitia?

On coins of Faustina I with the rev. legend VESTA, Vesta is usually portrayed holding palladium, with either a simpulum, a sceptre, or a torch. The palladium is a primary attribute, and is not borne by other personifications; we may therefore state that any figure holding a palladium should be identified as Vesta. The sceptre and the torch are also borne by other personifications, and so are secondary and not determinative of type.

One rev. type with the legend AVGVSTA shows a female figure 'sacrificing from patera over altar and holding palladium'. This type equally combines attributes which would usually define the figure either as Vesta or Pietas, and therefore I have given this figure the compound name Vesta-Pietas.
